The Churchill and Trinity Colleges AHSS Residential will bring to Cambridge budding Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences students, like you, from August 1 to 4. Attendees will experience university life: from staying in student accommodation, to experiencing taster supervisions, lectures and seminars, to researching, writing and submitting an essay. Participants will select an interdisciplinary topic to focus on throughout the residential, which will enable exploration of multiple possible degree subjects – and introduce subjects you may have never even heard of! The residential is free of charge and open to applications from UK state-educated students in Year 12 or equivalent.
