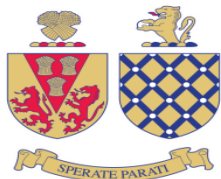

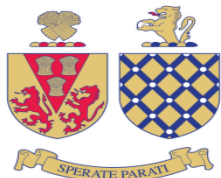

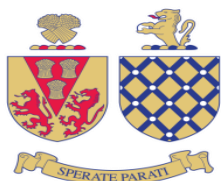
FORM TIME

 - We have now elected this term's form representatives. Many of the pupils seem keen to hold a position.



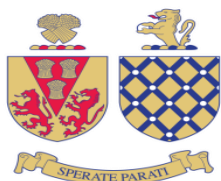
PACE SESSIONS

- Upcoming topics include independent learning, healthy bodies, personal hygiene, conflict and social media



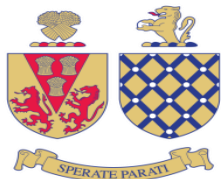
CLUBS

- PE, music and general club timetables are displayed in form rooms



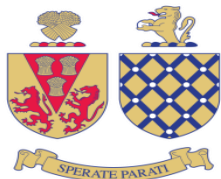
LATENESS

- If you bring your child to school by car, please consider dropping them off and collecting a short distance from school to avoid congestion on Lady's Close.



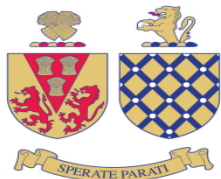
UNIFORM

- Only one pair of discreet stud earrings allowed (to be removed for PE), no nail varnish or make-up



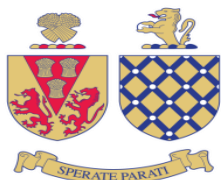
MOBILE PHONES

- This includes over a weekend



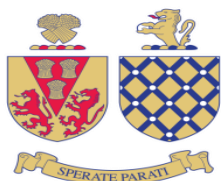
KEEPING ORGANISED

- Encourage your child to use their planners and homework timetables
- Check planners weekly
- Homework can also be found on teams and viewed weekly by parents
- Pack school bag the night before
- Check Parentmail often
- Lost property is stored in the foyer of Hyde House for a limited time



EQUIPMENT AND LOCKERS

- Pupils need to have their pencil case, planner, rough book, device and water bottle for every lesson
- They are not able to access lockers during lesson time to get equipment
- Pupils should pack their bag the night before
- Getting a lock cut off costs the student £1 (which will be donated to charity)



YEAR 7 MATHEMATICS

- Largely revisits and strengthens skills from KS2 then looks to extend where appropriate.
- Pupils taught in forms until October half term. Then will be placed into sets on basis of setting test result. More information will be given at the time.
- Setting test will only test topics taught by WGGs, and will be **Thursday 14th October**.
- Once in sets, pupils who find maths difficult are in smaller classes, and learn at a more appropriate pace for them.
- Please do not help too much with homework. Encourage your daughter to ask her teacher.
- Computer programmes My Maths and Mathswatch will be used for homework and can be used by pupils for revision help.
