## FORM TIME

- Weekly structure:

## LATENESS

## UNIFORM

- Keep up the great uniform

- Make sure every piece is named, including PE kit
- If PE kit is forgotten on 3 occasions, a lunchtime detention is issued.
- Only one pair of discreet stud earrings allowed, no nail varnish or make-up.
- All Jewellery, including religious artifacts must be removed for PE, no exceptions.


## MOBILE PHONES

- Mobile phones must be turned off and stored in your daughter's locker at the start of the day.
- Remember, if a pupil is found using their phone during the school day, it is confiscated for a week.
- This includes over a weekend.


## KEEPING ORGANISED

- Encourage your child to use a planner/ weekly organiser.
- Encourage you child to pack all items for the following day, the night before.
- Homework can be found on teams and viewed weekly by parents
- Parents to check Parentmail and newsletters weekly.
- Lost property is stored for a limited time. Students can look in the designated lost property areas to retrieve items.

## YEAR 7 MATHEMATICS

- Largely revisits and strengthens skills from KS2 then looks to extend where appropriate.
- Pupils taught in forms until October half term. Then will be placed into sets on basis of setting test result. More information will be given nearer the time.
- Setting test will only test topics taught by WGGS, and will be Wednesday 11th October.
- Once in sets, pupils who find maths difficult are in smaller classes, and learn at a more appropriate pace for them.
