

At Watford Grammar School for Girls, we want to:


- teach students how to learn languages

- Listening, reading, writing and speaking activities








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WHAT SHOULD STUDENTS BE DOING AT HOME?

HOW MIGHT THIS APPROACH DIFFER FROM WHEN I WAS AT SCHOOL?


- 1. We do not follow a topic based approach. The sounds, vocabulary and grammar are taught in order of frequency of use.
- 2. We do not use a text book
- 3. Vocabulary is introduced prior to the lesson
- 4. We do not teach students, phrases or sentences to remember


Schools in England are facing a looming funding crisis, with spending per pupil in 2024-25 expected to be 3% lower than in 2010, according to research.
